## U.S. Census Bureau says Townships are Critical to the Success of the 2010 Census

In August

the U.S. Census Bureau sent invitations to townships to participate in the 2010 Decennial Census Local Update of Census Addresses Program. This program allows local governments to work with the bureau to update its address records, ensuring an accurate census and, in the long run, potentially more federal funding for some communities.

### Why fill out the census form?

Every household in the country will receive a questionnaire in 2010. To ensure an accurate and fair count of all populations at all geographic levels in the nation, the Census Bureau needs you or someone in your household to respond to the census guestionnaire.

### It's important. –

Census data affect funding for your community, your community's representation in Congress and your community leader's planning decisions.

Census affects funding in your community Census data directly affect how more than \$300 billion per year in federal and state funding is allocated to communities for neighborhood improvements, public health, education, transportation and much more. That's more than \$3 trillion over a 10-year period. Spending just a few minutes to fill out your census form will help ensure your community gets its fair share of federal and state funding.

### It's easy. –

The census questionnaire takes only a few minutes to answer and return by mail.

### It's confidential. –

Your responses are protected by law (Title 13, U.S. Code, Section 9). All Census Bureau employees have taken an oath to protect confidentiality and are subject to a jail term, a fine – or both – for disclosing any information that could identify a respondent or household.

### It's required by law. -

The information you provide is combined with responses provided by your neighbors and other households across the country, to provide summary statistical data that are used by various local, state and federal agencies.




Construction started on the new West Manheim Township building in August















### **DEPARTMENT NEWS:**

Since the last newsletter, the Police Department has added an additional patrolman bringing the total to eight full-time officers. In May, 16-year veteran, Toby Wildasin, was promoted to Sergeant. He's been kept busy supervising criminal investigations and assisting Chief Tim Hippensteel with the administrative work of the department, congratulations Sergeant Wildasin!

### **SERVICES:**

In addition to pro-active patrol, traffic enforcement and criminal investigations, officers conduct daily house checks for those who are out of town and frequent business checks during nighttime hours. Complimentary fingerprinting for employment, adoption and other purposes is available by appointment. Pfc. Craig Snyder recently received training on the proper installation of child safety seats in vehicles. Please call the office to schedule a time for a courtesy inspection of your child's safety restraints.

### **SHOULD I CALL 911?**

The department frequently receives calls at the police station that would have been better placed directly to 911. The department urges residents to call 911 to report any active or recently occurring incident, however minor it may seem. Officers are radio and computer dispatched through 911, and can respond to your call more effectively. If you have any doubt about the urgency of your call, please call 911 to avoid a delay in the response.

### **IDENTITY THEFT:**

With 2725 calls for service, 2007 was our busiest year ever. The department is seeing an increase in crimes related to credit card fraud and identity theft. Numerous residents have reported unauthorized accounts being opened or bank accounts being fraudulently accessed. There are several steps you can take to reduce the risk of becoming a victim. ### 2008 Fire Hydrant Flushing

Water Utility Crews will be performing maintenance with the township water system and will be flushing hydrants. This will occur approximately the 3rd or 4th week of April (weather and drought conditions permitting). The process of periodically "flushing" fire hydrants is a preventive maintenance activity done on a routine basis to verify the hydrants are properly working, and to assure continued high quality drinking water. During the flushing process you may experience low water pressure as well as a temporary discoloration in your water supply. By allowing your water to run for a short period of time, the problem should clear itself. Also, once the hydrant flushing is complete, the water quality and pressure will improve.

## West Manheim Township Utility Easements

Per West Manheim Township Ordinance #05-2006, all professionals doing work on the properties located within the township are required to register and pay a fee.

This includes anyone who charges a fee for providing a service that affects the property and/or structure such as repairs, replacements, and additions. The ordinance does exclude cleaning and delivery services along with sales personnel. Please note that door to door pedaling and hawking for the purpose of sales require a separate permit.

Please take note of the requirements set by the Ordinance. Building and Zoning Permits will not be issued to those contractors neglecting to register. The registration and fee will be valid for one year. The registration fee is a yearly charge of \$50.00. Failure to comply with the provisions set by this ordinance may result in a stop work order or further legal action if necessary. If additional information is needed please contact the township office at 717-632-0320.

When Township residents plant shrubs, flowers, and split-rail fences in the front (or street) right-of-way, it impacts the utility easements on the remainder of the home or building lot.

We continue to encounter more situations where residents have planted shrubs, trees, fences, sheds. etc. within the utility easement around their property. A utility easement is a right of way that exists solely for the purpose of maintaining, repairing, or replacing the utility located within it. That utility could be water, electric, natural gas, telephone, or cable. But more than likely it will be sanitary sewer. Most of the problems occur in the newer developments. The easements should be identified in your property deed and should be pointed out by your realtor when the house or lot is purchased. You run the risk of having to tear out the planted shrubs, trees, and fences if the Township or other utility company needs access to their lines. Since the Township doesn't allow those items to be placed there, the Township will not replace them.

### \*\*\*NO\*\*\*

Plastic Food tubs, Baby wipe tubs, Salad/ Deli containers. No other numbered plastic is to be recycled.

### Newspaper

### \*\*\*YES\*\*\*

Newspapers, glossy inserts, telephone books, magazines and junk mail only. Tie in bundles or put in brown grocery bags and place in your recycling bin.

#### \*\*\*NO\*\*\*

Plastic bags. Newspapers placed in plastic bags will NOT be picked up.

\*\*\*Sharps - needles should be put in sealed containers (i.e. sealed plastic bottle) and put in trash container/bag.

### SPECIAL NEEDS QUESTIONNAIRE INSIDE

West Manheim Township Emergency Services is updating a list of the residents that may require assistance in the event of an emergency in the township. This questionnaire information is kept confidential. This information will aid emergency responders in meeting the needs of township residents that may require evacuation or sheltering during an emergency. Please mail the completed form back to the Township Office as soon as possible.

### **HOUSE NUMBERING**

The Requirements of the Ordinance include:

- (1) SIZE OF NUMBERS—The number must be a minimum of 3" in height for residential houses. The stroke or width of the number should be a minimum of 1/2". The number must be visible from the road by person with normal vision.
- (2) **VISIBILITY** –The numbers posted on the house should be visible from the road fronting the property. If you are unable to see the house from the road the house numbers should be visible from both directions of travel on a post or sign. The post location, if needed, must be close to the driveway, and if a mailbox is used as identification, no other box may be in front of this property.
- (3) **COLOR**-The color of the numbers must have a contrasting background or light reflecting to make visibility easier.
