THINKING ABOUT A GENERATOR?

This past stormy winter has caused many residents to think about installing a portable generator in case electricity service is interrupted.

You are reminded that an electrical permit is necessary before a generator can be installed.

While generators come in handy when severe storms knock out power, they need to be operated safely. You can't see or smell the deadly carbon monoxide produced by a generator and it can kill quickly.



According to the Consumer Product Safety Commission, one generator can produce as much carbon monoxide as hundreds of cars.

Here are some tips for using a portable generator:

- Do not use indoors, or in a garage, basement, or shed.
- Use generators outside, away from windows, doors, and vents or any other opening in the house.
- Make sure you have a working carbon monoxide alarm.

Remember, yard waste materials including tree trimmings, shrubbery, leaves and other organic vegetation will be picked up with your weekly recyclables. Branches cannot exceed 6 inches in diameter and bundles must not exceed 4 feet in length and weigh more than 30 pounds. Materials should be placed in biodegradable bags or tied in bundles.

STREET SWEEPING


Depending on the weather, Public Works will begin our annual street sweeping at the end of March. All Township streets will be cleaned so please be patient until we get to your area



PA One Call System

In Pennsylvania homeowners and contractors are required to contact PA One Call, by dialing 8-1-1 at least three business days before beginning any digging or excavation project. When PA One Call receives a call, it will alert the appropriate underground facility owners of the intent to dig. The underground facility owners will identify any underground lines or facilities at the work site.

The PA One Call system is a communications system established to prevent damage to underground facilities and promote safety. It provides on telephone number for contractors and the general public to call for notification of their intent to use equipment for excavation, tunneling, grading, boring, blasting, demolition or any similar work. **For more information visit the PA One Call Web site www.paonecall.org**

The cold weather is wreaking havoc on more than just your commute and your car.

As the water repeatedly freezes and thaws, a cavity below the road is formed and larger cracks develop, destroying the strength of the pavement.

West Manheim Township residential recycling services are provided by York Waste Disposal. We recycle through a "single stream" meaning that all recyclables can be co-mingled.







York Waste Disposal Recycling Guidelines

Acceptable Items for Recycling:

- \checkmark Aluminum food and beverage containers
- Glass food and beverage containers (brown, clear and green)
- \checkmark Bi-metal, steel and aerosol cans
- PET plastic containers with the symbol #1 narrow neck containers only.
- HDPE plastic containers with the symbol #2 narrow neck containers such as milk and water bottles, detergent, shampoo, bleach bottles etc. without caps.
- Plastics with symbols #3 #7 narrow and screw top containers.
- Newsprint
- Cardboard; flattened in 2' x 2' bundles (may be placed in recycling bin along with other recycling.)
- Residential mixed paper (junk mail, magazines, glossies, telephone books, printer/copier paper.)
- Cereal boxes

Unacceptable Items: 🔀

- Window or auto glass, drinking glasses, mirrors, light bulbs, ceramic, porcelain, microwave trays, glass cookware/bake ware.
- **V** Un-numbered plastic items
- ▼ Plastic bags
- Salad/deli containers
- Plastic food tubs
- Household items such as cooking pots, toasters, etc.
- **X** Batteries
- Cardboard/paper with wax coating or liners

ELECTRONIC RECYCLING

Pennsylvania's E-cycling Law

Deginning January 24, 2013, Pennsylvania's "Covered Device DRecycling Act" (Act 108) will impact how to manage certain electronic devices. Under the Act, "covered devices" include televisions, desktop and laptop computers, computer monitors and computer peripherals (anything that connects to a computer such as a mouse, keyboard, printer, etc.). Starting January 24, 2013 the Act prohibits the acceptance of these materials at all Pennsylvania solid waste disposal facilities and also prohibits residents from placing them at the curb for waste pick-up. Under the Act, waste haulers will NOT pick up electronic devices. York County residents and businesses must now recycle these devices.

E-cycling Accepted Items

Items accepted include answering machines, compact disc players, electric typewriters, fax machines, hard drives, laptops, mobile phones, modems, microwave ovens, pagers, personal computers (CPU, monitors, keyboards, mouse, and peripherals), printers, printed circuit boards, radios, remote controls, stereos, tape players, telephones/telephone equipment, televisions, and VCR's.

Do Not Bring

Electric equipment (such as toasters, hair dryers, wall clocks, or electric razors) OR construction demolition, furniture, appliances (such as vacuum cleaners), white goods, or household hazardous waste.

Why is Electronic Waste a Potential Problem?

Electronic equipment contains lead, mercury, cadmium and chromium which have environmental consequences when disposed of improperly. One computer can contain up to as much as eight pounds of lead.

E-cycling Program

The York County Solid Waste Authority offers an ongoing Electronics Recycling Program held the third Saturday of every month from 9AM to 1PM at the Authority's Yard Waste Transfer Facility located off of Flour mill Road in Manchester Township.

Residents, businesses, non-profits and institutions are eligible to participate and may bring unlimited quantities of electronic devices. There is no fee to participate. In addition to the Authority's E-cycling program, residents may also deliver a variety of electronic devices to Best Buy's York store located at 2865 Concord Road, York, PA 17402. There is no fee.



PLAYGROUND SAFETY

A quick checklist for parents

Place this list in a prominent area of your home for quick reference. Then, before your children head out the door for the playground, check that:

Supervision is present, but strings and ropes aren't.

Adult presence is needed to watch for potential hazards, observe, intercede and facilitate play when necessary. Strings on clothing or ropes used for play can cause accidental strangulation if caught on equipment.

All children play on Age-appropriate equipment.

Preschoolers, ages 2-5, and children ages 5 -1 2, are developmentally different and need different equipment located in separate areas to keep the playground safe and fun for all.

Falls to surface are cushioned.

Nearly 70 percent of all playground injuries are related to falls to the surface. Acceptable surfaces include hardwood fiber/mulch, pea gravel, sand and synthetic materials such as poured-in-place, rubber mats or tiles. Playgrounds surfaces should not be concrete, asphalt, grass, blacktop, packed dirt or rocks.

Equipment is safe.

Check to make sure the equipment is anchored safely in the ground, all equipment pieces are in good working order, S-hooks are entirely closed, bolts are not protruding, there are no exposed footings, etc.

BE PREPARED FOR AN EMERGENCY

The likelihood that you and your family will survive a house fire depends on having a working smoke detector and an exit strategy. The same is true for surviving other emergencies. Plan on having the tools and plans in place if disaster should strike.

Get a Kit of Emergency Supplies:

- Water, one gallon per person per day
- Food, at least a three-day supply of non-perishable food
- Battery-powered radio and extra batteries
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- First aid kit
- Whistle to signal for help
- Filter mask or cotton t-shirt to filter air
- Moist towelettes for sanitation
- Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- Manual can opener
- Plastic sheeting and duct tape
- Garbage bags and plastic ties

• Unique family needs, such as daily prescription medications, infant formula, important family documents *Make a plan for what you will do in an emergency.*
